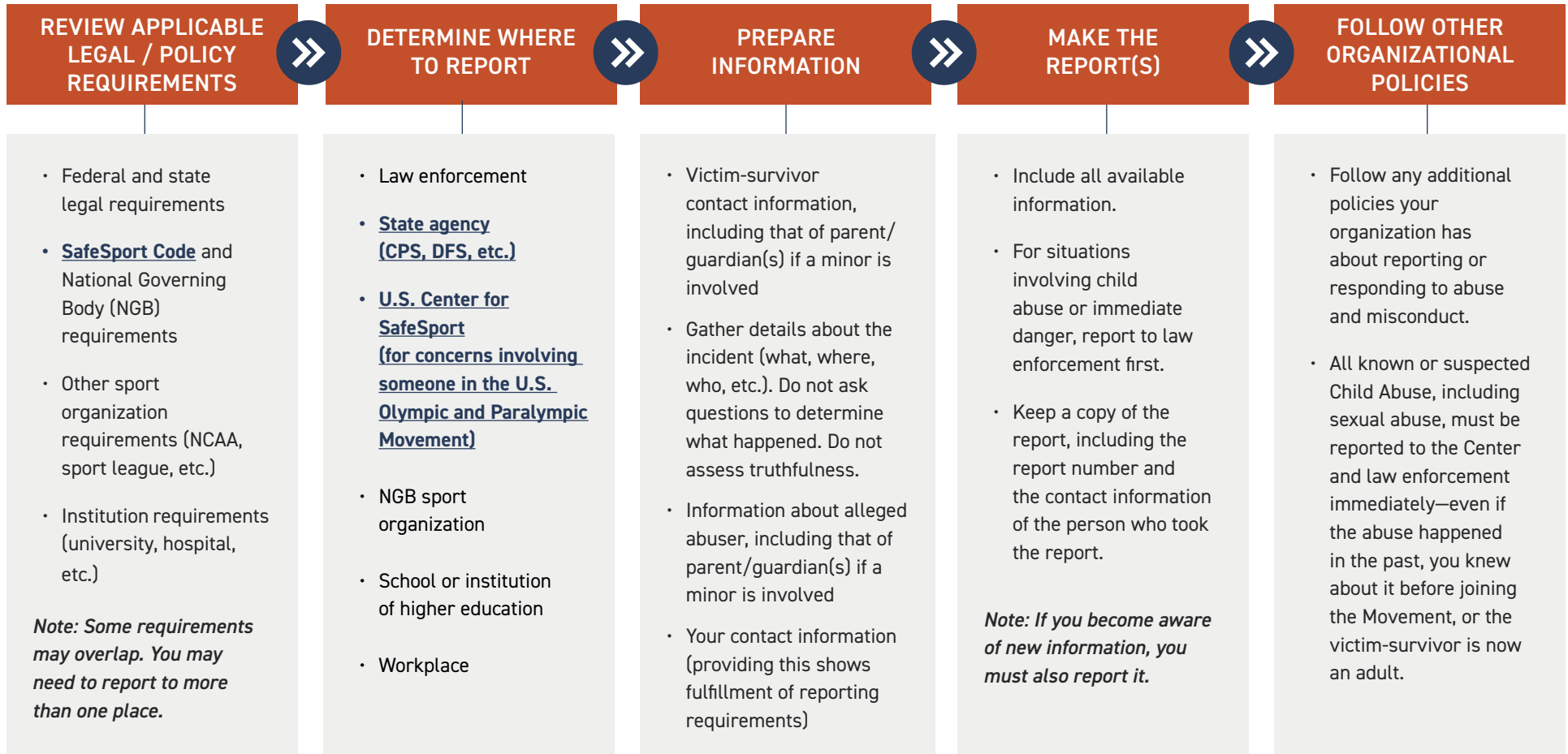


STEPS FOR REPORTING ABUSE AND MISCONDUCT

MANDATORY REPORTING FOR:
Adult Participants in the U.S.
Olympic and Paralympic Movement
